

How to get to the Circuit

By Train:

Zandvoort Station is around 15 minutes' walk from the circuit gates and offers regular train services to Amsterdam, Haarlem and other nearby cities. The train is the best means of transport to get to and from the Dutch Grand Prix, though congestion can still be expected at peak times. The trip from Amsterdam to Zandvoort takes 30 minutes and special return tickets (Dutch Grand Prix Retour) cost approximately 12 EUR per day - buy your tickets in advance online or at any train station in the Netherlands.

By Bus:

Both public bus services and organized coach transport from all corners of the Netherlands are available for fans travelling to the Dutch Grand Prix.

By Car:

An exclusion zone is in place near Zandvoort on race weekend that restricts vehicular access to the area. In addition, general parking is not available close to the circuit. Park & Ride lots are available in Amsterdam and Amstelveen with bus transfers to the circuit. Park & Bike lots are also available, with the option of riding your own bicycle to the circuit or hiring a bicycle.

By Taxi:

Taxis cannot enter the exclusion zone around Zandvoort on race weekend. Use public transport instead.

By Walking/Bicycle:

If you are able to secure accommodation in the town of Zandvoort or nearby, then getting around on foot or by bicycle is your best bet! Bicycle parking areas are free next to the circuit, but you must [reserve your space in advance on this link](#).
